### Principal's Message-*Maggie Buchan*

Dear Friends,

It is my pleasure to welcome you back for the new school year. The goal for Troy in 2009/10 will be to continue to provide outstanding educational experiences for every student despite the challenging economic times.

The fiscal crisis facing the state of California will certainly continue to challenge all levels of education, from K-12 education to the Community College, California State University and University of California systems. It is important to note as stated in the most recent FYI published by the Fullerton Joint Union High School District that this district "has been able to weather the financial storm better than most school districts because of the prudent fiscal management of the Board of Trustees" even with the loss of over 18 million dollars in revenues over the last two years. However, our challenge for the future will be to continue to provide the same excellent education with reduced fiscal resources, increased class size and a reduction in support staff.

The focus of staff development and early release days for 2009/2010 will continue to be student-centered activities; working to improve

## COUNSELING CORNER

Before beginning this edition of Counseling Corner, I would like to take this opportunity to introduce the members of our Department for the 2009-10 school year: Dr. Janine Van Poppelen, Assistant Principal/Pupil Services; Dr. Marwan Nabi, Assistant Principal/Pupil Services; Mrs. Carrie Montoya, Registrar; Mrs. Susan Reese, Data Processor; Mrs. Lisa Williams and Mrs. Maria Williams, Guidance Technicians; Mrs. Jacqueline Morck, Counselor (A-C); Mrs. Sarah Saleen, Counselor (D-I); Mrs. Linda Yen, Counselor (J-L); Mrs. Dionne Evans, ROP Coordinator and Counselor (M-R), Mrs. Lisa Avila, Counselor (S-Z) and Miss Katy Hoehn, Counseling Consultant. Throughout the school year, we hope that you will feel free to contact us if you have questions or concerns.

This year, the Counselors will continue with the Case Carrier Model and meet with students individually throughout the year. Parents of freshmen and junior students will be invited, along with their students, to a pre-scheduled meeting to discuss various topics of interest. Seniors and sophomores will be seen individually during an elective course. **The timeline for the counseling appointments will be as follows: seniors, September - mid October; juniors, January - March; sophomores, March - June; and freshmen, mid October - December.**

The Counseling Office is very excited about our new purchase of an online educational software program called Naviance. Our goal is to introduce the program during the individual counseling sessions. As the counselors become more familiar with the program they will communicate the information to the students and parents. The program will include a 4-year high school plan, college search and match, resume building, and many other benefits.

### Senior Reminders:

University of California and California State University applications will be available online beginning October 1. Remember that the UC applications can be submitted between November 1-30 and the CSU applications can be submitted between October 1-November 30. Students may access the UC website through PATHWAYS at [www.ucop.edu/pathways](http://www.ucop.edu/pathways) beginning October 1. The students can begin the process in steps before submitting the application. Prospective CSU students may submit their application, take a campus tour, obtain preadmission, financial aid, and admission information for one or several CSU institutions via the Internet. Students may access this CSUMentor program at <http://www.csumentor.edu>. Because students include an academic self-report on the UC and CSU applications, it is not necessary to send transcripts at this time. Students will be notified by

these institutions when to send an official transcript. **Mrs. Montoya, the Registrar, will send transcripts for you at no charge.**

Applications for private colleges and universities can be obtained by contacting the admissions offices on the individual campuses. Contact these independent institutions as soon as possible. Some private institutions accept the Common Application which can be downloaded online. Deadlines will vary by campus; many private schools extend their deadlines to January or later. Students applying for Early Action or Early Decision should ensure that all supporting documents will be completed and postmarked on time.

Counselors will visit all senior Government/Economic classes on **September 25<sup>th</sup>** to discuss updates on the UC/CSU systems and review the process for obtaining letters of recommendation for private colleges and universities. All material covered at this meeting can be accessed under the Counseling section of the Troy website ([www.troyhigh.com](http://www.troyhigh.com)).

### SENIOR LETTERS

Early in the school year, selected seniors received letters from their Counselor outlining course and unit deficiencies and possible options. If you received such a letter and have not yet responded, please see us as soon as possible. By planning ahead, you will have an opportunity to complete all of your graduation requirements in a timely manner.

### College Night

We hope that all Troy juniors and seniors and their parents join us for our annual College Night on Monday evening, **September 21**. Over 85 college and university representatives will be in attendance this year. We send a special thanks to Mr. Lindsay Knox and the members of the National Honor Society, and Commander Alan Stubblefield and the NJROTC cadets, who will greet and assist our college representatives.

### PSAT TEST

This year, the PSAT Test will be given at Troy on Saturday morning, **October 17**. Counselors will visit **all sophomore and junior English classes in early October** to distribute information about the test. Students (10th and 11th) may purchase a ticket for \$20 in the Activities Office. All students who take the PSAT will receive a score report and interpretive information approximately six weeks after the test date. We plan to distribute these reports in mid-December, and we will advertise the specific dates of distribution in the Daily Bulletin.
